What We Do

All Among Us provides secure transformative housing and supportive wraparound services to women who have struggled to achieve and maintain stable housing independence. Our women focus on seeking stability in the areas of recovery, housing, finances, relationships, physical health and mental health, and employment.

How We Do It

We provide services through three programs: Women's Care Center transformative housing, Aftercare support services, and Crisis Direct Aid to the homeless community.

What Makes Us Unique

- **Transformative Housing:** Women stay in our Center up to two years, long enough to heal and have the best chance of avoiding relapse. During this time, they access resources necessary to recover from addiction, mental illness, and other trauma-based afflictions.
- **Supportive Services:** Our residents participate in many excellent community-based services while at the Center and receive ongoing care when they transition and establish independent lives.
- **Recovery:** Residents have two years to make recovery their #1 priority. Recovery opportunities for trauma, addiction, and mental illness are offered. During this time, if they do not have income, they do not pay rent. We encourage their commitment to recovery (often 25 hours per week) over the need to obtain a job.
- **Trauma:** Providing trauma care was the focus of 2022. Much of mental illness and addiction stems directly from trauma experienced at an early agree. Our ladies completed a three-month program on generational trauma using the Generations Deep book and author/counselor Gina Birkemeier as our lead and mentor.

Our Primary Programs

Women's Care Center - Our Women's Care Center, founded in 2018, provides live-in housing for women experiencing poverty, homelessness, addiction, mental illness, domestic violence, and other trauma-based issues. We house up to nine women at any one time, and up to 20 women annually. Admission is based strictly on applicants' willingness to make positive changes through participation in the following programs:

- Women with addiction participate in recovery with our partners, such as Salvation Army, Independence Center, Places for People, Queen of Peace, and local AA/NA/GA programs.
- **Residents create and manage their budget** to pay down debt, save, pay rent, and allot funds for transportation, housing, and everyday needs.
- Women find and retain jobs and earn the respect of employers and colleagues.
- **Residents maintain both physical and mental health** by attending doctor appointments, weekly counseling, adhering to recovery programs, and taking medication as prescribed.
- In our group setting, women learn essential life skills necessary for eventual independent living.



- In our secure environment, residents grow their passions and interests, build relationships, learn the value of diversity, and positively participate in society.
- Women work on trauma recovery through classes, counseling, and informed and effective coping strategies.
- Women prepare for independent housing by learning about housing costs, budgeting, and housing options.
- **Residents budget for transportation** and master the public transportation system to get to work, recovery classes, appointments, doctor visits, and shopping.
- **Our women focus on spiritual health** through self-study, group studies, and worship services—finding hope and comfort even in their hardest times.

Aftercare - Our Aftercare Program extends care and services to women who have completed their work at the Women's Care Center and moved on to independent living. These women have jobs or disability income, continue to be actively involved in their recovery, and continue to grow financially, emotionally, and socially through ongoing support from All Among Us. Aftercare participants stay connected to the center through visits, celebrations, advocacy, accountability, community, and friendships.

Crisis Direct Aid Services - Warm meals in winter. Cool water in summer. Kindness all year. That's what our trained group of volunteers deliver to St. Louis's homeless, and more. **This personalized outreach program gave All Among Us our beginning.** We simply went to people on the streets who were desperate for life's basics. We provided them with supplies, friendships, and the offer of hope. Cathryn started by taking beautiful photos of the homeless, making copies, and providing envelopes for them to send the photo to family members to let them know they are alright.

Well, my life was a total wreck before I came to All Among Us. I was drugged out of my mind, most of my siblings had passed and I didn't care about nothing and no one.
